

1. Can you place Aerosol Cans in your recycling bin?



*Aerosol cans may be placed in the recycling bin as long as they are completely empty*

2. Is Polystyrene (No 6 code EPS) allowed to be placed into the bin?



*This product is unsuitable for our recycling service; however this product can be placed in your garbage bin*

3. Are household liquid laundry containers recyclable?



*Small laundry containers are acceptable in the recycling service provided they are empty*

4. Can car parts be placed into the recycling bin?



*Car parts must be placed out for collection in the hard waste service or be taken to your local Council transfer station for disposal*

5. Do you need to rinse containers prior to recycling?



*It is not a requirement to rinse containers however they must be emptied prior to going into the recycling bin*

6. Is paper separated from cardboard in the recycling process?



*Paper is separated from cardboard in the recycling process. The more cardboard removed, the higher the grade of paper produced*

7. Are Aluminium food trays recyclable?



*Aluminium food trays as well as aluminium cans are acceptable in your recycling bin*

8. What about BBQ gas bottles. Are they acceptable?



*Gas Bottles/Dangerous Goods(e.g. Chemicals) are a threat to our sorting staff. These items are to be disposed of in the correct manner at your local council drop off facility*

9. Are plastic coat hangers allowed in your recycling bin?



*Plastic coat hangers must be placed in the garbage bin or given to charity for reuse*

10. Can coffee/tea cups (which are considered crockery) be recycled?



*Crockery and ceramics must not be put in the recycling bin. They must be put in the garbage bin. They are considered a contaminant*

11. Are paper cups allowed in the recycling?



*Paper cups are allowed in the recycling bin*

12. Is Window glass able to be placed in the bin for recycling?



*Window glass must be placed in the garbage bin as it is not recyclable in this service*

13. What about straws, pens, wooden sticks or skewers?



*These items must be placed in the garbage bin*

14. Can clothing, shoes, string or rope be placed into the recycling bin?



*These items must be placed in your garbage bin*

15. Is bathroom and toiletry packaging recycling able to be placed into the bin?



*Items such as shampoo bottles, can be placed in the recycling bin*

16. Are paint tins recyclable?



*Paint tins are recyclable provided they are empty and dry of contents*

17. Are video tapes/DVDs recyclable?



*Video tapes are not recyclable and create problems in our sorting process. Please place them in your garbage bin*

18. Can I place my recyclables in plastic bags and then place into the recycling bin?



*Recyclables in bags go to landfill as the bags cannot be broken and checked due to Occupational Health & Safety reasons*

19. What about garden hose and electrical wiring. Are they allowed in the recycling bin?



*They are not allowed in the recycling bin*

20. Can you place finely shredded paper in the recycling bin?



*Finely shredded paper contaminates the glass bottles and creates sorting difficulties*

### BACK TO TOP

1. Should you place recyclables in plastic bags then place into the recycling bin?



*This product is unsuitable for our recycling service, however this product can be place in your garbage bin*

2. Can you place paper from your printer into the recycling bin?



*You can also place white, magazines, newsprint and junk mail into your recycling bin*

3. Are gas bottles/dangerous goods allowed into your recycling bin?



*Gas Bottles/Dangerous Goods(e.g Chemicals) are a threat to our sorting staff. These items are to be disposed of in the correct manner at your local council drop off facility*

4. What about car batteries ? Are they allowed?



*Car batteries are not allowed in the recycling service. They have sulphuric acid in them and are dangerous to the sorting staff. Your local council drop off facility can generally take car batteries*

5. Should you place food waste into the recycling?



*Food waste should always go into your garbage bin*

### **Which of the items below can be placed in your recycling bin...**

6. Plastic Milk Bottles



*Milk containers are acceptable in the recycling service provided they are empty*

7. Plastic bags		<i>This product is unsuitable for our recycling service, however this product can be placed in your garbage bin</i>
8. Office Paper/Junk Mail		<i>You can also place magazines and newsprint into your recycling bin</i>
9. Glass Bottles and Jars		<i>They can be placed in the recycling bin as long as they are completely empty</i>
10. Plastic garden chairs		<i>Plastic garden chairs must be placed out for collection in the hard waste service</i>
11. Computer Components		<i>E-Waste may be placed out for collection in the hard waste service or be taken to your local Council transfer station for disposal</i>
12. Nappies		<i>Nappies must be placed in the garbage bin</i>
13. Green Waste		<i>Must be placed in the Green Waste Bin provided</i>
14. Soft Drink Bottles		<i>You can place all types of Soft Drink Bottles into your recycling bin</i>
15. Rope/String		<i>Rope/String must be placed in the garbage bin</i>
16. Cups, Plates and Crockery		<i>These items must be placed in the garbage bin. They are considered a contaminant</i>
17. Steel Cans		<i>Steel Cans are acceptable in the recycling bin provided they are empty</i>
18. Fire Extinguishers		<i>Fire Extinguishers are a threat to our sorting staff. These items are to be disposed of in the correct manner at your local council drop off facility.</i>
19. Cardboard		<i>All types of cardboard can be placed into the recycling bin</i>
20. Plastic Film		<i>This product is unsuitable for our recycling service, however this product can be placed in your garbage bin</i>
